Year 6 Children

Once we have returned after Easter there are 4 weeks before the SATs test. With that in mind, good attendance, plenty of rest and sleep, fresh air and exercise and minimum screen time are essential.

The children have already been practising individual questions and whole papers to ensure they understand the style of questions and pace at which they need to work.

Miss Boyd has kindly put together a pack, which the children can use over Easter and into the first 4 weeks of next half term to keep revising. Practising times tables, checking spelling rules and lists and ensuring grammar terms are in their working memory, are all important skills and knowledge to revise.

This week in school:

- On Monday and Wednesday, the children in Years 1,2,3, and 5 had an Active Maths Lesson provided by an external company. If the provision is a success and we see positive impact, we hope to continue this across the summer term. The initial feedback from the children was very positive.
- Flourish Challenges, have been happening across the school. Willow Class created an art gallery inspired by Van Gogh, Beech Class have sewn a science learning toy for Willow Class and Oak Class recreated a Tudor Model Village for the children in Reception to walk through! This learning is all independent and provides us with the opportunity to assess some of their skills and knowledge.
- > Sadly, we had to postpone the Cricket Event today, due to forecasted high winds and rain. this will be re-scheduled for next term.
- The chicks have hatched and we have all enjoyed watching them feed, grow and listening to the 'cheeps'! The chicks will all now return to Isabelle's (Y6) farm thank you to the Marks family for their time, support and advice in caring for the eggs and chicks. The children have all had the opportunity to carefully hold the chicks, and learn about their growth, feeding and needs.
- We have welcomed 2 new children to our school this week. Immy (Y5) and her sister Jess (Y3) have spent some time in Beech and Oak classes this week as part of their transition. We look forward to getting to know both girls and their family over the coming weeks, months and years!
