Key achievements to date:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
 Playground markings updated and providing opportunities for new engagement with physical activity for children through the day. Pupils have physical activity prior to learning in the morning – impact on focus for first Phonics and Spelling lesson. Children noticeably more focused. Forest School OAE has provided a different physical opportunity for learning, which has excited children about the potential of learning outdoors and being physically active in a different way. Use of West Sussex schools partnership provided opportunities for connection for the pupils during Lockdown.
