Results of Parent Reading Survey September 2022

- 1. Do you enjoy reading as an adult? Yes = 91% No = 9%
- 2. If you do enjoy reading, what kinds of things do you enjoy reading for pleasure? This was a wide, very eclectic mix of reading materials. Only 20% of responses included reading using online materials.
- 3. If you answered no, what are the main barriers to your enjoyment?

The responses here included: lack of personal time, historical experiences of reading, being bullied as a child at school for struggling with reading.

4. Describe your child's reading abilities **at home**. Is your child a proficient or struggling reader? Explain why you think this is.

74% felt their child is proficient for their age

Of the remaining 26%: reasons given included:

- COVID interfered with foundations of reading
- Reading stamina
- Time at home
- Attention span
- Dyslexia

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Of the 24 families who said their child/ren are proficient / love reading: 8 read 3-4 times a week and 16 read 5-7 times a week.

Of the 10 families who said their child/ren struggled / not proficient: 1 reads 0-2 times week, 8 read 3-4 times a week and 1 reads 5-7 times a week.

(Lack of motivation, other interests/activities, lack of books at home) Of the 12 responses for this: 25% mentioned time 33% mentioned other interests 25% mentioned motivation – but once reading fine 8% mentioned dyslexia 8% mentioned current confidence level impacting motivation 10.
