Premier Education were also used to support the training and development of teachers' knowledge through observations and lesson planning.</li> <li>A yearly overview is being used to map the coverage of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils through Premier Education and teacher led sessions including after school clubs.</li> <li>PE lead created two-year overview to show coverage of all sports for both Key Stages.</li> <li>Spreadsheet document created to record students attending competitions. PE lead and teachers use the document to ensure all children are given opportunities to attend events.</li> <li>Athlete event organised involving World Championship Gymnast Kelly Simms coming into school to lead a session with all pupils.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Establishment of a paid scheme to support teaching staff in the planning and delivering of lessons.</li> <li>CPD through SSP partnership and PE lead to ensure staff are confident with planning and assessing children in PE.</li> <li>Play Pals to be introduced and established to train children in leading physical activities at break and lunch.</li> <li>Upgrade playtime equipment to encourage more physical activity during break times.</li> </ul>
