We are all off to the seaside: letter in book bags today (youngest siblings will bring home letters)

This has been the first week of the class topics and this half term the entire school have the theme – The Seaside. The class teachers have been finding out what knowledge the children already have, to enable them to refine any planning for the weeks ahead.



The end point for all classes is to visit the seaside. On the 10th October all 3 classes will go to either West or East Wittering for a morning of learning.

Willow Class will use beach finds to create spiral and shell shapes as the final part of their art learning.

Beech Class will visit East Wittering to look at cafes as the final part of their food technology learning.

Oak Class will use the coastline as their inspiration to write poetry for their final assessment of the term.
