Free School Meals

If you are **in receipt of any** of the list below your child may be entitled to free meals throughout their education. This also triggers vouchers for holiday schemes / free group music lessons from West Sussex.

- Universal Credit (if you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of state Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit.

Staff meetings, INSET, school visits, training, working with locality and research support our plan. The plan also includes workshops for families and children, which we look forward to inviting you to.


Worship
