Beach Trip

All children should wear home clothes: trousers / shorts /joggers and t/shirts and a jumper/hoodie and trainers/strong shoes and bring a thin rain coat if it looks likely to rain – currently the forecast is great.

All children should ensure they have sunscreen on them before they arrive.

Children in BEECH class need to wear trainers / strong shoes – they will **not** change into wellington.
