Harvest - Thankyou

WOW! Thank you so much to our community and families for filling the basket for Chichester Foodbank.

A large-scale study in January showed that 30% of children and young people were skipping breakfast, often due to food insecurity. You cannot sleep or learn when you are hungry. This is a significant problem in schools, in all areas of the country, including our own.



If you have not been able to bring something in as it may have slipped your memory, the basket will remain in the foyer until the start of Monday next week.

Harvest Worship

Today our Worship Leaders led a special Worship for the school. They showed how letters from the word Harvest can be rearranged to spell the word: **Earth**. Our **Earth** has sufficient food for everybody.

You can also make the word **STARVE** from Harvest. Statistics from January 2024, showed that eight million adults and three million children are living with food insecurity.

Today we learnt that there are 1,439 McDonald's in the UK and almost 2,900 Foodbanks. The leaders showed the children how taking just a few items to a foodbank can make a difference.
